RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

March 2025 – present

Postdoctoral research, “Beyond the Hashtag: The Formation of a Feminist Movement Against Gender-based Violence in the French Contemporary Art World”

This research explores the formation of a feminist collective against gender-based violence in contemporary art beyond digital feminist activism practices. It explores how its organizational structure, collective identity, goals, interpretive frames, tactics, and strategies to create social change are negotiated and defined within the movement. Overall, this research aims to explore continuities and change in feminist activism, the transformation in the relations between art and politics, and the effect of #Metoo on gender relations in the contemporary art world.

November 2023 – present

Preparation of book, *Gender-based Violence in Arts and Culture. Perspectives on Education and Work.*

Co-editor, with Marie Buscato and Sari Karttunen. The edited volume explores the pervasive issue of gender-based violence in the realms of art and cultural production and the reconfiguration of gender relations in these sectors after #Metoo. The book covers a wide array of artistic sectors – opera, visual arts, music, and theatre – across diverse global contexts, from Europe to Asia and North America.

October 2020 – April 2024

Postdoctoral research, “Gender-based violence in art schools: between reproduction and denunciation”

In the wake of the Weinstein affair and the #Metoo movement, women and men have disclosed and denounced gender-based violence in various artistic sectors. Yet, despite the recent increased visibility of the topic, few researchers have explored women's experiences of gendered violence in artistic places of education and work. Based on the case of French schools of visual arts, this research studies the forms of gender-based violence experienced by female students, the social processes and relations that produce and silence them, and their consequences for women's integration in the contemporary art world. It also examines individual and collective strategies, institutional measures and public policies implemented to address them. Overall, this research aims at understanding how gender-based violence in artistic education contributes to maintaining gender segregation in the contemporary art.

September 2013 – November 2019

Doctoral Research, “Artistes mais femmes. Formation, carrière et réputation dans l'art contemporain”

This research aims at understanding why women artists are underrepresented at the highest levels of artistic and economic reputation, although they are in the majority in art schools and almost half of visual artists are women in France. Based on a large sociological investigation, combining quantitative and qualitative methods, the thesis offers a new perspective on gender inequality in artistic careers by examining the career paths of the graduates of a prestigious French school of visual arts.
